## COVID-19 Update

Please remember that if your child is showing any symptoms of COVID-19, however mild, they must remain at home until they have received a negative PCR test. The main symptoms remain to be:

- a high temperature
- a new, continuous cough
- a loss or change to sense of smell or taste

If a child returns a negative PCR test, they may return to school as normal providing they are well enough to do so.

As a result of a small number of cases in Y2, additional temporary measures have been put in place to minimise any further spread of the virus and to avoid any unnecessary disruption to education. As ever, we all have our part to play in protecting each other so please do not send your child into school if they have any symptoms, or are awaiting the results of a PCR test.


