RIGHT RESPECTING SCHOOL - PUPIL PARLIAMENT

At Cheadle Hulme Primary School, we are committed to the **United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC)**, meaning we place the Rights of the Child at the heart of our curriculum, school ethos and culture.

One of the most important ways in which we do this is by placing huge emphasis on pupil voice in school through our Pupil Parliament. This comprises a number of groups responsible for different areas of school life including digital culture, the environment, charity fundraising and sport. These groups meet regularly to plan how to improve our school on behalf of all pupils and are held accountable by relaying what they have done by sharing with fellow pupils in assemblies and in 'Cabinet' meetings with the leadership team.



Once a year we also have a 'Commons' vote which involves the whole school. In the last of these, the children asked for some first aid training which happened last term courtesy of Millie's Trust. ROYAL ACADEMY YOUNG ARTISTS' SHOW

This year we have entered our school into the Royal Academy's Young Artists' Summer Show. This is an opportunity for UK based young artists aged 4-18 to make and share a piece of artwork that truly expresses their own voice.

Each child can submit one piece of artwork along with a short artist statement or description (no more than 80 words), written in their own words where possible to describe why an artwork was created and what it means to them.

Submitted artworks are judged by a panel of artists and arts professionals, with selected artworks displayed online and on-site at the Royal Academy of Arts!

Your child will bring home a permission slip, if they wish to enter a piece of art. Submissions can be brought into school and given to Miss Haigh, along with the permission slip, to be submitted. Entries close on the 4th March, [more details can be accessed here](#).
