UNIFORM UPDATE

As we shared in a recent newsletter, we have worked with our suppliers on some small changes to elements of the school uniform. One of the changes is a move across to a new cheaper, more ecological, unisex blazer which, alongside the other 'branded' items has the newer logo.

These newer items are on sale now through Express Uniform (and are due to be soon through our other suppliers) who were on site this week for a pop up sale.

As we have previously shared we are now entering a transition period where we will be fading the old items out. We would like this to be complete by September 2026 but given the financial factors, this will be a flexible marker rather than a fixed deadline.

In the meantime, both Express Uniform and Monkhouse have reduced items bearing the old branding. These items can be purchased on their respective websites.
