SHOW RACISM THE RED CARD

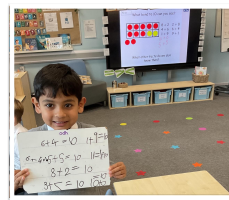
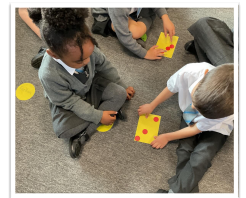
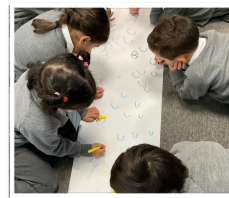
Next Friday Cheadle Hulme Primary School will be taking part in an event organised by Show Racism the Red Card (SRtRC), called 'Wear Red Day'. SRtRC is the UK's largest anti-racism educational charity, and you can find out more about the organisation here: <https://www.theredcard.org>

Wear Red Day is an event to raise awareness and will include additional focus in class on the day. As such, the school will not be collecting any money, but if you did want to donate to the campaign, or if you just want to find out more about it, the website can be accessed here. At school, children and staff are being asked to wear something red. It can be wearing lots of red clothes, or as simple as wearing red socks. On the day we will be talking to children about the organisation and why it was first established. We will be sharing resources produced by Show Racism the Red Card and will discuss the importance of children knowing what to do if they ever experience or witness racism.

October is also Black History Month during which the children will be learning about a significant figure in history, the story of their life and the contribution they made in their field.
