Welcome

We are delighted that our proposed primary free school, Cheadle Hulme Primary School, has progressed to the preopening phase. We are now required to undertake a public consultation. The Laurus Trust is a newly formed trust with Cheadle Hulme High School (CHHS), the founder school, at its centre. CHHS is a hugely oversubscribed academy converter with a reputation locally, and further afield, for outstanding teaching and learning through the relentless pursuit of excellence and a determination to ensure that every child succeeds. CHHS is a Teaching School and has been judged Outstanding in every category by Ofsted in 2011 and 2015. Gorsey Bank, a high performing local primary school joined Laurus on 1st October 2016 and co-wrote the bid to open a new primary school in Cheadle Hulme.

Our proposal

The Laurus Trust is proposing to open a brand new primary school in September 2018. The name of the new school will be Cheadle Hulme Primary School and it will have its own 26 place nursery.

Our founding pupils will have a unique opportunity to be the first cohort to start their outstanding education at our nursery or in our first Reception year at Cheadle Hulme Primary School. Their education journey can then continue at either Cheadle Hulme High School or our new secondary school, Laurus Cheadle Hulme, which will be located on the same site as the primary school (subject to planning permission).

Cheadle Hulme Primary School will be a non-selective, non-denominational, two form entry primary free school and nursery. We will have a maximum class size of thirty pupils and at full capacity 420 primary pupils will attend our purpose built school with access to state of the art facilities and overlooking Bruntwood Park (subject to planning permission).

Our proposal is that the Secretary of State for Education enter into a Funding Agreement with the Laurus Trust. A Funding Agreement is the contract between the Secretary of State for Education and the Trust that sets out the terms on which the school is funded. This will enable the school to offer unconditional places and open in September 2018.



Why does Cheadle Hulme need a new primary school?

Not only will the creation of Cheadle Hulme Primary School address the growing demand for school places in the area, it will extend the outstanding education already provided by Cheadle Hulme High School to our local nursery and primary aged children.

Stockport Local Authority fully supported the bid we submitted in 2014 to open a new primary school as their statistical analysis pointed to a places shortfall in Cheadle Hulme.

"The primary schools in the area are full and it is projected that without an additional school being created there will be pressure on local school places. We welcome this bid by Cheadle Hulme High School as it will help deliver the extra places that are needed."

Our Nursery will be an inspiring early years setting providing 26 places from birth to 5 and a seamless transition to Cheadle Hulme Primary School. There will be free child care places¹ available at our nursery.

Cheadle Hulme Primary School will be a purpose-built facility and will provide the local community with access to state of the art facilities including sports pitches, a sports hall, a multi-use games area, a multi-activity studio and hall (subject to planning permission).

The proposed footprint for Cheadle Hulme Primary School is on a parcel of land behind Cheadle College and overlooking Bruntwood Park. It was previously occupied by Ridge Danyers College Moseley Building which was demolished in August 2000 due to structural issues. The site is within an established residential area close to existing shops, services and public transport links.

Anticipating that local residents may be concerned about the potential increase in traffic in the vicinity of the new school, the Trust is developing a detailed strategy for parent drop-off and pick-up with Highways Officers at Stockport Council and a comprehensive and robust Transport Assessment and Travel Plan will be submitted in support of our planning application.

Please note that this consultation is not related to any building or planning applications surrounding the new school; it is solely to consult on whether appropriate persons support the Trust to enter into a Funding Agreement with the Secretary of State for Education to run Cheadle Hulme Primary School. There will be a further consultation on site layout in May, ahead of the planning application.

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¹Currently 15 hours a week for 3-4 year olds. Some 2 year olds are also eligible for free child care.




Elise Drake Head of School
