



# Cheadle Hulme Primary School & Laurus Cheadle Hulme Construction Site Newsletter

No. 3 - May 2018

Welcome to our newsletter, which aims to keep you up to date with what is happening on our site.

## What we are building

A new primary school and a new 11-16 secondary school to provide much needed additional school places for local residents. The schools, including a 26 place nursery, will open in September 2018, although construction will continue until early 2019. These are free schools, funded directly by the Department for Education, and operated by an approved provider, the Laurus Trust.

## **Recent progress**

Good progress has been made since our last newsletter with purple walls appearing, especially on the primary school (this isn't the final colour as a brickwork façade is being built to the front of the purple boards) and the following works:

- All the steelwork is complete, together with concrete to all floor levels and roofs
- The permanent roof construction is complete to the primary school and the roofs to both the secondary school and sports hall have commenced
- Brickwork to the external façade of the primary school is under construction
- Plasterboard internal walls and mechanical, electrical and ventilation services are well progressed to the primary school, with plastering due to commence in the next 2 weeks
- The external landscape works plus roads and car parks have also begun around the primary school

## What's next?

We will continue with construction of the external façade to the primary and secondary schools with a mixture of brickwork, cladding and windows, and also with the following works:

- Roofing to the secondary school and sports hall
- · Internal plasterboard walls to all buildings
- Mechanical, electrical and ventilation services to all buildings
- Commence the internal finishes to the primary school
- Landscaping works to both schools including the sports pitches
- Kerbing to roads and car parks and preparation of road surfaces

Deliveries will continue via the existing college entrance with site parking accommodated on the current rear car park. Security will continue to be monitored during the daytime by a security/gateman and covered by CCTV on a 24/7 basis.

#### **Environment and community**

BAM is committed to minimising our impact on the environment and to making a positive impact on the local communities in which we work. This includes reducing our carbon emissions, recycling, and wherever possible diverting waste from landfill. As much as possible we'll use local subcontractors and suppliers, and offer employment and training opportunities to local people.

For example, so far we have created 22 new jobs on the project for local people and have five apprentices and trainees working on the project. We recently hosted three work experience placements, which led to one student being accepted onto our higher apprenticeship programme, and a school leaver being offered a permanent job with our subcontractor, PM Reinforcements (PMR). Our BIM Co-ordinator and Trainee Site Manager recently delivered careers talks to Cheadle Hulme High School students to give young people a greater insight into the roles available in construction and we have accommodated tours of the site to engage the local community (see below).



## **About the Laurus Trust**

The Laurus Trust is a multi-academy trust with Cheadle Hulme High School (CHHS), the founder school, at its centre. CHHS is a hugely oversubscribed academy converter with a reputation for outstanding teaching and learning and a determination to ensure that every child succeeds. In 2015 and 2011, CHHS was judged Outstanding by Ofsted in every category.
