Welcome to our newsletter, which aims to keep you up to date with what is happening on our site.

What we are building

A new primary school and a new 11-16 secondary school to provide much needed additional school places for local residents. The schools, including a 26 place nursery, will open in September 2018, although construction work will continue until early 2019. These are free schools, funded directly by the Department for Education, and operated by an approved provider, the Laurus Trust.

Recent progress

The design of the new schools has developed over the past six months and gained planning approval in October. In developing the design proposals we carefully considered all the comments received from the public consultation events and online survey, and have addressed these wherever possible.

For example, the new school buildings are located as far away as possible from the local residential properties. North Downs Road will be restricted to staff members and deliveries only, and improvement works will be undertaken to Cheadle Road and Orrishmere Road to ease congestion at peak times.

What's next?

Next we will be installing our temporary site offices and welfare facilities and starting work on site. Initially, our cabins were to be located at the rear of the houses on West Downs Road. However, in order to further minimise disruption to residents, we have reached an agreement with the college to remove some dilapidated Portakabins from an area within their site so we can set up our temporary cabins there. Works get underway week commencing 4th December 2017 with the following activities:

- · Site boundary fencing and hoarding
- Clearance and provision of perimeter footpath
- Site clearance of trees and vegetation
- Drainage
- Earthworks

Deliveries will be via the existing college entrance with initial site parking accommodated on the current rear car park. This will help to minimise disruption in the surrounding area. The site will be closed for Christmas and New Year from 22/12/17 to 02/01/18 but full time security cover will be in place.
