Keeping Children Safe Online

Teaching eSafety to our children both as part Computing and PSHE lessons is an important part of our school curriculum and contributes to our overarching mission to 'prepare our children for a world we know and a world yet to be discovered'. We acknowledge that, realistically, the impact of this work is only ever going to be borne out in how our children engage with technology and the many forms of social media (including gaming) outside of school.

The value of establishing positive habits with technology cannot be underestimated and with 53% of children in this country owning a phone by the age of 7, it is essential that these positive and responsible habits are established early. Ways you can do this are by:

- Modelling good use of technology as adults: are we spending far too much time on our own phones? Do we make sure they are away at the dinner table? Are we modelling not oversharing on social media (or the wonderfully titled 'sharenting') where we post pictures of our children without their consent?
- Ensuring our children are not left alone online, particularly in their bedrooms overnight
- Finding out more about the apps they are using: do we know enough about the supposedly 'safe' ones? Developers program these apps to be as addictive as possible so relying on children's willpower to limit their use is not a fair fight. At the very least, a lot of the apps that include short-form videos (eg YouTube or TikTok) reduce focus and attention span and contain videos often modelling less-than-desirable behaviours, and on the more concerning end of the spectrum, the fact is that child sex offenders will be going to the apps that children use (including the likes of Roblox).

Whilst the above may raise uncomfortable questions or thoughts, it is important that we set clear boundaries for the use of technology and most importantly, take an active, consistent and engaged interest in your child's digital world and activities.

In many ways the Internet is a fascinating parallel of the real world - it is inspiring, amusing, entertaining and informative but it is also dangerous and risk filled. Being able to navigate it is now an essential life skill. Educating and protecting children in this area of life is arguably one of the most important things we need to do, both as parents and educators.
