Pupil Parliament Elections

We are excited to have begun the re-election process for the majority of departments in our Pupil Parliament and give a different group of pupils the opportunity to influence and/or lead on various aspects of school life. In this week's assembly, we revisited why we have a Pupil Parliament and the mindset behind a book of speeches by climate activist, Greta Thunberg, entitled 'No One Is Too Small to Make a Difference'.

Below is an overview of the Pupil Parliament groups that are open for re-election, their main remit and the year group membership criteria.

- **Department for Education** champion the wonder of reading for all pupils and adults in school and the wider community (Y1-Y4)
- **Department for Environment** responsible for reducing energy use, waste and to promote a clean and cared for environment (Rec-Y4)
- Home Office be role models for all other children as House Captains and coordinate House competitions and events throughout the year (Y4)
- **Department for Digital Culture** raise the profile of technology in school and the enhancements it can make to our curriculum and lives beyond school, contribute to the delivery of e-Safety workshops (Y1-Y4)
- Ministry of Justice contribute to the development of our Rights Respecting ethos in conjunction with the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (Y1-Y4)
- **Department for Sport** organise initiatives to promote healthy lifestyles and contribute to the development of active play at break/lunch times (Y1-Y4)
