UNICEF Rights Respecting School

As many of you know, we are a UNICEF Rights Respecting school meaning we place the Rights of the Child at the heart of our curriculum, culture and ethos. We strive to ensure the Rights of the Child, along with the values of dignity, justice and respect (which is also one of our curriculum drivers) underpins all that we do, from the Early Years right through to Key Stage Two.

We want our children to be passionate advocates for the rights of others, whilst also understanding that all adults have a duty to help children to enjoy their rights. Each term, the children explore a number of rights (often referred to as articles) which link to the theme and Curriculum Bookshelf their learning is based on. This enables them to contextualise and discuss rights through stories and the ways that characters behave. Our whole school assembly focus builds on this work and the article named in each newsletter links back to the story that was read and messages that were shared.
