As teachers, we can sometimes forget we are using school-specific vocabulary so it was useful to collaborate to ensure these are as parent friendly as possible!
- **Use of MCAS** we discussed the issue of having no search functionality in the messages section. We can certainly relate to this and feel your frustration on this point. We will share this feedback (again!) with the development team at the company. In the meantime, we will do our best to further streamline our communications on this platform to support parents/carers in seeing the most important content clearly

They had minutes to prepare but did not disappoint the group with their input. College Update

On Monday, we invited the Project Manager and Social Values Manager from Willmott Dixon, the contractors who will be building the new college building on the land next to our school. They spoke with the children about the design, the environmental considerations they hold highly and the potential impact that construction work can have whilst in the 'messier phases'. I have asked for an updated timescale for the project and key dates so that I can share this with families to be aware of.

Throughout the build we will continue to liaise with colleagues from both the college and construction company as we need to operate in a mutually considerate way as neighbours on site.

Attendance and Punctuality

Ensuring children are in school every day is one of the absolute priorities we must share as a school and parents/carers. In addition to this, arriving on time is really important as this ensures pupils get off to a great start from the minute they come into school. 
Mr Gillard led this week's Rights Respecting assembly and spoke with the children about the their right to relax, play and take part in a wide range of cultural activities. He
