Welcome back to the second half of the autumn term, we hope all our families enjoyed a relaxing week off. We wanted to start this new term by sharing some of our foci as a school this academic year (work on all of which has already begun). As a school leadership team, we have a document which we refer to as the School Development Plan (SDP); this year's SDP contains points including further improving writing outcomes in school, developing our support for pupils whose first language is something other than English, and reviewing our current PSHE curriculum including a focus on online safety and what we refer to as Digital Wellbeing (more to follow on this in next week's newsletter).

Aside from these areas though, there are three priorities which we thought important to share with you all as parents and which we will provide updates on over the course of this year (and which we may need your support with!)

READING FOR PLEASURE

Reading is one of the hardest things anyone can learn to do but equally is arguably the most important academic skill of all.

As such, it is essential we collectively nurture a climate of reading for pleasure so our children learn to love books and therefore see the point in going through the hardship in the first place!

The reading culture here is already strong but we'll be supercharging it over the next few months both in school and also sharing ways in which all our families can get involved!

RIGHT RESPECTING SCHOOLS GOLD AWARD

We're always very proud to be able to call CHPS a Rights Respecting School - it allows us to explore some of the challenges that are out there in the world at the moment, to ensure our pupils know their own rights and also to ensure that, as 'duty bearers', they understand their role in ensuring those around them have their rights fulfilled.

This year as a school we'll be taking this to the next level, enhancing what we do in this area and hopefully achieving the top level of this award to make us Gold!
